Bushy Park Project Scope

- 1. Levelling outfield
 - a) Cylinder mower for ongoing maintenance
- 2. Grass practice square and nets
- 3. Flattening square table
- 4. Improving rain covers
- 5. Power distribution locations for future projects

1. Levelling outfield

a. Ongoing upkeep taken by HHCC including the purchase of a mower (currently contracted)

Advantages	Risks
 Improved safety in all use of the ground Opens up parts of the ground for training Now we are in Div 4 of the Surrey Championship for the first XI our outfield gets rated every week* – our current outfield could prevent us from rising through the leagues *(All games that have panel umpires) 	 Is it feasible for us to maintain the ground going forward or will we need contractors to do this still SF available from 2024 season Contractor currently costs £125 per cut Likely to increase in 2022 Approximately 3 hours to cut outfield with 36" cylinder mower

2. Grass practice square and nets



Specs

- 52ft x 75ft (16m x 24m) grass practice square
- 6 x practice pitches (7ft), 1 x junior match pitch (10ft)

Benefits

- No turf removed from within the club's boundaries.
- No requirement for planning permission
- Not as constrained by ECBs regulations
- Only location that allows spread of wear on both sides of the square without proximity to the paths
- Location is key and to be discussed on next slide
- Allows us to train and play matches at the same time to increase training capacity
- Junior match pitch in front of pavilion encouraging use of the pavilion during games

Costs

~£9000 for materials



2. Grass practice square and nets cont...

- What do we have now?
 - 1 x 18m concertina mobile net
 - 1 x ~7.2m fixed mobile net
- Considerations for net selection
 - Current storage is at capacity
 - Health and safety with proximity to path and other players
 - Cost
- Options
 - Use current nets
 - Purchase 2nd 18m combi cage
 - Look to another net system

3. Flattening square table

Scope

- Raised lumps have built up on each crease over time called saddles
- The saddles would be removed levelling the square with the outfield

Advantages

- Reduced impact on bowlers at the crease health and safety
- Reduced likelihood of rained off games
- Will have no impact on how the square plays
- Square will be playable the season immediately after the work is completed

<u>Risks</u>

- There is a risk if the work isn't started early enough that it might not be ready for the next season
- Mitigation: the ground would be handed over to the contractors as soon as the league season is finished (6 aside still to be discussed)



4. Covers

- Not covered in this project but needed to be considered as a likely future project
- Roll on covers are easier for groundsman to take on and off and more efficient than flat sheets
- Flat sheets can be used as side sheets to keep water away from pitch
- Try and find out from Surrey when the ECB small grants are to be reinstated so we can take advantage of this
- Storage of these is to be considered alongside storage requirements of nets

5. Feasibility of putting power points for the nets and for the compound

- At the same time as the outfield levelling electrical power from the pavilion would be dug into the ground
- These would be used for powering future projects:
 - The bowling machine at the location of the nets both at the practice square and for the existing astroturf
 - The groundsmen's compound for the mower
 - Camera's for streaming cricket matches (located at each sightscreen on the ground)
- Whether this is included in the immediate development plans will depend on cost

Carlisle Park development

- Meeting with Stakeholders Middlesex, Surrey, Richmond Borough, Friends of Carlisle Park
- RFQ with three companies Total Play, Verde Sports, Dura Sports
- Meeting on site with these companies w/c 13th December
- 3 possible locations within Carlisle Park to install a new net facility
- The Carlisle Park Cricket Association (Woodlawn and HHCC) will own the nets so we need to file for planning permission
- Indicative costs £17,000 + VAT per lane
- Likely to be two fully enclosed lanes
